Foam Ladybug

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Recipe:

Thread: 8/0 black uni-thread Hook: TMC 101 #14-16 Body: Peacock herl

Legs: Brown/black hackle

Back: 3mm or 1/8 th inch thick orange evazote or sheet foam

Tying Instructions

- 1. Place the hook in the vise. Attach the thread behind the eye of the hook, and wrap the thread backward, stopping a few turns past the barb. Over the barb, place a drop of super glue on the thread base.
- 2. Cut the strip of foam about as wide as the hook gape and bevel the edges at a 45 degree angle. Tie in the orange foam just over the barb of the hook.
- 3. Over the barb of the hook, tie in the brown hackle you will palmer up the body to make the legs.
- 4. Over the barb of the hook, tie in the peacock herl you will use to make the abdomen.
- 5. Wrap the peacock herl forward to a point about two hook eye diameters from the eye of the hook
- 6. Sparsely palmer the hackle forward to the same point and clip it flat on the top side of the hook.
- 7. pull the orange foam forward to the point where you tied off the herl and the hackle and tie it down, leaving a head shaped piece of foam extending almost completely over the eye of the hook.
- 8. Using a fine pointed black sharpie, place small black dots on the back of the beetle.
